Can groups volunteer with Arundel House of Hope?

Yes. We welcome service groups, businesses, schools, faith communities, clubs, and community organizations.

What types of group opportunities are available?

Groups may participate in donation drives, meal service, facility projects, special events, seasonal projects, and other one-time or recurring volunteer opportunities based on organizational needs.

Does every group member need to complete an individual application?

No.

Can youth or student groups volunteer?

Yes. Youth and student groups are welcome. Adult supervision may be required depending on the activity and setting.

How do we schedule a group project?

Groups should contact us in advance to discuss project ideas, scheduling, group size, and organizational needs so we can coordinate an experience that is meaningful and manageable for everyone involved. Please email info@arundelhoh.org to begin the planning process.



What size groups can volunteer?

We do our best to accommodate groups of all sizes, from small to large teams. Depending on the activity, staffing, and space available, larger groups may be split between different locations or scheduled in shifts to ensure a safe, organized, and meaningful volunteer experience for everyone involved.
